To get a feel for posing your subject, sit in a chair in your everyday lifeplace the arms when they are in a relaxed state. Then, try to utilize these positions in your posing. For example, the model can sit on the floor with her legs forward (in a side view), placing her hands behind her (without locking the elbows) and leaning back to put some of the weight of her body on her arms and hands with her feet turned toward the camera. This is a very common relaxed pose that also helps provide a nice profile of the bust, showcasing the natural curves of the female body.
