Qualitative Research Definition and Methods

Qualitative Methods. Qualitative research methods are most appropriate in situations in which little is known about a phenomenon or when attempts are being made to generate new theories or revise preexisting theories. Qualitative research is inductive rather than deductive and is used to describe phenomena in detail, without answering questions of causality or demonstrating clear relationships among variables.

Qualitative research studies typically seek to answer questions about the 'what', 'how', and 'why' of phenomena. This is in contrast to the questions of 'how many' or 'how much' that are sought to be answered by quantitative research, including epidemiologic studies and clinical trials.
